## SCRIPTURES:

### November 13th– Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

**First Reading:** THE PROPHET MALACHI WARNED THAT THE TIME WOULD COME WHEN ALL THE EVIL PEOPLE WOULD BE PUNISHED. HE THEN SPEAKS OF THE ARRIVAL OF "THE SUN OF JUSTICE, WITH ITS HEALING RAYS," BELIEVED BY MOST TO MEAN JESUS. (MALACHI 3: 19-20A)

**SECOND READING:** SOME OF THE THESSALONIANS CLAIMED CHRIST'S RETURN WAS IMMINENT, SO THEY STOPPED WORKING AND ASKED OTHERS FOR FOOD. PAUL DESCRIBES HIS WILLINGNESS TO WORK, SO THAT HE WOULD NOT IMPOSE ON OTHERS. HE ENCOURAGES THEM TO FOLLOW HIS EXAMPLE AND EARN THEIR OWN LIVING. (2 THESSALONIANS 3: 7-12)

**GOSPEL:** JESUS WARNS OF THE PERSECUTION ALL CHRISTIANS WILL FACE BECAUSE OF HIM, AND HOW SOME WILL EVEN BE PUT TO DEATH. YET HE SAYS THEY WILL NOT BE HARMED BECAUSE "BY PATIENT ENDURANCE YOU WILL SAVE YOUR LIVES." IF JESUS' FOLLOWERS ARE LOYAL, THEY WILL BE RESURRECTED AND THEIR SUFFERING END. (LUKE 21: 5-19)

# Missionary Initiative

One of the tasks of Catechesis is to promote a missionary spirit that prepares Christians to witness to Christ in society.

The catechists of elementary, middle and high school students prepare our youngsters to accept and live out this task in their adult years. One of the most effective ways of doing this is to provide our students with a variety of supervised service opportunities.

Our students here at Our Lady Star of the Sea are involved in such missionary activity. All of the students will be bringing food items to class over the next few weeks for the Thanksgiving food baskets that will be distributed on November 22nd. Our 8th graders will help assemble the food baskets for many in our area who would otherwise have very little on Thanksgiving Day.

Opportunities such as this build awareness of people's everyday needs and help students recognize that they have a responsibility to reach out to others. We try to help them make the connection between their actions and Jesus' call to care for others and the Church's commitment to social justice.

Through our initiation into the Christian community, each of us is given the vocation to "put on Christ," share the Good News, and to carry on the work of the Lord.

At the end of every Liturgy we hear, "Go, the Mass is ended." Some of us may recall the Latin, "Ite, missa est," which translates, "Go, He is sent."

The Mass never really ends because just as the Father sent His Son, Jesus, so we are sent to continue the mission of Jesus here and now in the Lake Hopatcong area.
