SCRIPTURES:

MAY 13th– Seventh Sunday of Easter

First Reading: The disciples decided that someone should take the place of Judas, who killed himself in remorse for betraying Jesus. They nominated two who had been among them from the time of Jesus’ baptism to the crucifixion. Then they drew lots to decide who would join them as witnesses of the resurrection.

(Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26)

Second Reading: John reminds us that God dwells in those who love one another. We have come to know God’s love for us. Only by loving one another can we be sure that God will remain with us always. (1 John 4:11-16)

GOSPEL: Jesus prays for His disciples at the Last Supper. He knows that by knowing the word of God as they do, they no longer belong to the world. He asks that God consecrate them in truth and protect them from the enemies they have made because of their belief in Jesus. (John 17:11b-19)

MARY, MODEL of CHRISTIAN LIVING

Mary, the Mother of Jesus, has been honored by the church since the earliest days of Christianity. Over the centuries, her name and image have been a source of devotion and reverence. When we take the time to focus on her humanness, her poverty, and the fact that she struggled with life just as we do, then we discover a model of Christian living that can support and guide us on our journey.

The little we know about Mary's life and actions is revealed in the Gospels. In the beginning, we see a woman whose faith in God is so firm that she is able to take a leap of faith and say "Yes" to the angel's request. We then see Mary and Joseph as parents and teachers. They are people who struggle with life and teach Jesus not only with words, but in how they live. Later, we see Mary, a widow and faithful mother, following her son's brief ministry to its tragic end on the Cross. Beyond the Crucifixion and Resurrection, Mary accompanies the frightened apostles as they receive the Spirit and the Church is born. It is in these Gospel narratives that we come closest to understanding the true person of Mary. In these humble and faithful incidents, we can find a model for Christian Living.

In her response of faith, Mary gave us an example of how we are asked to respond to God in our own lives. For like her, we also are called to hear the Word of God and act on it in our daily lives. Mary was a person who saw the needs of others and did something about them. As Christians we are called to step beyond our own lives and look with compassion on the world in which we live and respond to the needs which we see around us. By virtue of our Baptism, we share in the mission of the Church. We participate in this mission through our everyday life at home and at work. We live in a busy world – time, work, wants, and needs shout loudly; they take their toll on us and our families. Just as in our lives, Mary's faith, trust and courage were tested so often in the everyday experiences of her life.

May her example encourage us to lead strong Christian Lives based on sound values, which will enable us to go forth each day and help to renew the face of our earth.
